Frank Stella

Frank Stella first studied painting with Patrick Morgan at Phillips Academy. While majoring in history at Princeton University (B.A., 1958), he also studied painting with William Seitz and Stephen Greene. Although attracted by the physicality of abstract expressionism, Stella wanted to avoid figure/ground relationships and modeling of form; Jasper Johns' flag and target paintings (repetitive stripes, gestural facture, monochromy, and absolute congruence of format and subject) provided inspiration.

Stella moved to New York in 1959. That year, represented by his revolutionary Black Paintings, he was the youngest artist in the Museum of Modern Art's *Sixteen Americans* exhibition. He continued working in an austere style through the early 1960s, though later in the decade he developed his innovations in format and Expanded his use of nontraditional paints and colors (e.g. purple metallic). Throughout the 1970s and into the 1980s, Stella has increasingly explored the properties of color, surface textures (implied and actual), and the dichotomies presented by real space adjacent to illusionistic space. The scale and size of his pieces have become grander and the facture more gestural.

In the 1990s, Stella began making free-standing sculpture for public spaces and developing architectural projects. In 1992–93, for example, he created the entire decorative scheme for Toronto's Princess of Wales Theatre, which includes a 10,000-square-foot mural. His 1993 proposal for a kunsthalle and garden in Dresden did not come to fruition. His aluminum bandshell, inspired by a folding hat from Brazil, was built in downtown Miami in 1999. In 2001, a monumental Stella sculpture was installed outside the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.

Stella has produced print editions primarily in collaboration with Petersburg Press and Tyler Graphics Ltd. In addition to the *Sixteen Americans* exhibition, Stella was included in the *Three Americans* exhibition at Harvard's Fogg Art Museum, Cambridge (1965). Traveling retrospectives of his work were organized by the University of Michigan Art Museum (1982) was circulated by the American Federation of Arts. In 1983-84 he served as the Charles Eliot Norton Professor at Harvard University.
