Serra's work on paper, his prints and drawings, while complete unto themselves, evoke the spirit and physicality, the energy and lyricism, the formal aims and considerations that inform his sculpture. The six new large scale prints combine the use of etching and lithography and reflect the fundamental concepts of Serra's torqued ellipses, a remarkable body of work begun in 1996 with his exhibition of sculpture at the Dia Center.

This newest group of prints further demonstrates Serra's respect for the history and discipline of printmaking and his ability to expand its language and technical possibilities. "In the collaborative process to which Gemini is so committed, Serra's contribution from the beginning has been to push the medium to maximize the forcefulness of the image."

By virtue of their scale, texture, depth and weight, by their immediacy and sense of improvisation and physical gesture, "our encounter with the prints has much in common with our experience of the artist's sculpture. We can feel, as with Jackson Pollock's, drip paintings, not only the artist's actions but his presence."
